- Aluminum window frames, doors, roofing, lawn chairs, old pots & pans, satellite dishes, etc...
- Copper tubing, wire & absolutely anything that is copper.
- Brass faucets, pipes, valves, car radiators and anything else that is brass.
- Propane regulators, gas meters, pot metal, lead and stainless steel.

We accept any metal that a magnet does NOT stick to.

We accept the following:

- *Aluminum cans
- *Glass; clear – brown – green/blue (Please rinse and remove any lids.)
- *Alkaline batteries, all sizes
- *Automotive batteries
- *Fluorescent light bulbs (CFL), all sizes, must not be broken
- *Used oil & oil filters
- *Antifreeze
- *Paint

Green waste: tree limbs, leaves, etc...

Metals: aluminum, copper, brass, steel, etc...

E-Waste: Anything with a cord on it, TV's, computers, VCR's, stereos, copiers, fax machines, cell phones, lamps, etc...

Appliances without Freon: dryers, washers, stoves, dishwashers are free to homeowners.

Items that cost \$ to dump:

Appliances w/Freon: refrigerators & freezers are \$30 for homeowners, \$40 for business owners. \$10 with certified Freon removal sticker.

(Refrigerators and freezers MUST have doors removed)

Tires: \$2.50 without rim, \$7 with rim.

Automobiles: \$75, with all fluids removed.

Loyalton Landfill Commingled Recycling Pilot Program

This type of recycling is easy and can accept a wide range of materials. The following items do NOT need to be sorted.

Commingled Recycling:

Paper: All kinds, mail, office, newsprint, advertising, magazines, catalogs, phone books, shredded paper (bagged only), paperback or hard covered books. Please remove all staples, paper clips and any other metal.

Cardboard & paperboard: Corrugated cardboard, soda containers, cereal boxes, food boxes, and office file folders. Please remove any liners.

Milk or juice cartons & kid's juice boxes:

Rinse and flatten cartons. Please remove straws, empty and flatten juice boxes.

Tin & steel cans: Soup cans & food containers cleaned of food with labels removed. Clean aluminum foil & metal trays. Empty aerosol cans, dry paint cans & jar lids.

Plastic: ALL plastics with a recycling logo marked #1 - #7. Please rinse and remove any lids.

These items are NOT accepted:

Food soiled paper or boxes, plastic grocery bags, napkins, paper towels, light bulbs, toxic containers, industrial glass, ceramics, dishes, glassware, toys, CD's, videocassettes, garden hoses, pipes, styrofoam, needles and any other sharp items.

Misc. Recycling Information

Plastic grocery bags: Leonard's Grocery store in Loyalton has a collection container near the front of the store for plastic grocery bags. They do NOT accept produce bags, bread bags or any other kind of plastic bag.

Sierra Pacific Industries Co-Generation

Plant: Our local co-gen accepts green waste for burning. They accept all limbs, branches and misc. wood. They do NOT accept particleboard, painted wood or wood with nails in it. They are open Monday thru Friday 8am to 5 pm. Please check in at the office to sign a release form and instructions before dumping. Call 993-4402 for any questions.

Catalogs: Unwanted catalogs can be recycled at the Loyalton Landfill in the commingled bin. Keep in mind the best way to get rid of unwanted catalogs is to call the company and have your name removed from the mailing list.

Styrofoam packing peanuts: Most of the UPS stores in Reno take back Styrofoam packing peanuts. They will not accept biodegradable peanuts. The store clerks will be able to tell you what kind they are by looking at them.

CFL Warning! Lots of us have changed out all of our light bulbs and replaced them with the new spiral energy efficient CFL bulbs. These are fluorescent light bulbs and should NOT be thrown away. PLEASE recycle all shapes and sizes of CFL bulbs. They contain a small amount of mercury in them and should not be placed in the garbage. You can recycle these at the Loyalton landfill. If you break a CFL bulb in your home please go to the E. P. A.'s website at epa.gov/mercury/spills for information on how to properly clean it up.
